MSU ARC Meeting – November 7, 2023

Meeting was called to order by President, Tracy McKinney, W4IRT, at 7:00 p.m.

<u>Roll Call & Question of the Night</u>: Roll call was done and the question of the night was "What is your favorite radio and why?"

Program: Bill Call, KJ4W, presented an informative program entitled, "What Radio Should I Buy First?" about getting started with HAM radio equipment. He went over some of the typical questions that people ask when considering what equipment to start out with. Bill went through different options within the categories of hand-held, mobile, base, and VHF or HF.

For most new HAMs, Bill recommends starting with a basic VHF/UHF handheld radio. The two that he suggested as good starter radios are:

- **Baofeng UV -5R:** which is a 2m/70cm analog FM, dual watch. There are several variations available with many features. It claims to do 5 watts and has decent performance and is a little harder to operate. Priced around \$32.95
- **Yaesu FT-60 R**: 2m/70cm analog FM, one band at a time. Can do 5 watts and it is rugged, has excellent performance, and is easier to operate. Priced around \$154.95

When considering a mobile or base, basic VHF/UHF radio, Bill recommended the following radios:

- Alinco DR-735T: Priced around \$330
- Icom IC-2730A: Priced around \$310
- Yaesu FTM-6000R: Priced around \$300

These are all 50-watt output, analog FM, high-quality radios with remote control heads. They will work fine as a base station radio with a suitable antenna and 12VDC power supply.

For HF starter radios, Bill recommended the following:

- Icom IC-7300: Priced around \$1000
- Yaesu FT-710 Field: Priced around \$900
- Kenwood TS-590SG: Priced around 1,600

These are all 100-watt output, SSB/CW/data modes, high quality radios, covering 160 through 6 meters with an internal antenna tuner and sound card. There are other higher performance radios available that are more expensive, and smaller radios that could be used for mobile HF. Bill also mentioned that there are some HF radios that include VHF and UHF capabilities, but he does not recommend these for a new HAM.

Bill explained the different qualities of each type and brand of radio mentioned. He reviewed things to look for in a radio for a new HAM and cautioned buying used radios, although they can provide a valuable learning experience.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Bill Call, KJ4W, advised that there was one deposit for \$68.00 made and one payment was made by debit card for \$70.00 to ARRL for the trailer tower insurance. One payment was made to W5YI-VEC of \$14.00 for VE fees. He reports that the current bank balance is \$3,682.56. Prior to the meeting we have 94 paid members for 2023.

<u>System's Report</u>: Bill Call, KJ4W, reported that the only issue this month has been that he had to restart the HF Winlink computer when MSU forced an update to the operating system. Bill still hasn't finished the repair on the Hamlin repeater amplifier so it is still running at reduced power. Other than that, the 3 Club repeaters, the 2 APRS digipeaters and the two Winlink systems are all working well at the moment as far as he is aware.

<u>VE Report</u>: Bill Call, KJ4W, advised that we had a VE session after the October meeting. Michael Inman, K4MWI, and Phillip Wright, KK4AHW, who is now NJ3J, both upgraded to Extra Class. No exams have been requested for tonight.

<u>CERT Report</u>: Bill Call, KJ4W, informed the club that the Fall 2023 CERT course finished last week. The class started with 16 attending, and 11 finished; 4 of these are HAM radio operators presently. He reported that five CERT members plus one relative of a member have signed up to take the HAM radio course which will begin this Thursday, November 9. Bill expects other people to attend the license course as well, besides the CERT graduates.
